Household Hazardous Waste Collection

Final preparations are under way for the 11th Annual Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection to be held Saturday, September 22, at the Westmoreland Fairgrounds from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Even after collecting more than 488,340 pounds of HHW for the past 10 years, demand for the program is stronger than ever, as more and more residents become aware of the dangers of improperly disposing of the unused paints and chemicals lying around in sheds, basements, garages, and even kitchens.

Westmoreland County municipalities corporations partner with Westmoreland Cleanways to keep the program affordable (and even free) to most residents by providing financial support to defray the cost of the collection. Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) pays for 50% of the total cost, with municipalities and corporations providing the other 50%. Residents of employees municipalities and sponsoring sponsoring corporations can dispose of their HHW at no cost. All other participants may be charged up to \$40 per carload, depending on the quantity of material.

Tire/Battery/Appliance/Scrap Metal Collections will be held September 15 at the Westmoreland Fairgrounds and October 6 at Norwin Hills Shopping Center.

Our industry was affected by oil prices just like everyone else's, so the cost of tire disposal and freon removal have increased.

Tire Disposal: \$2.25 off-rim/\$5.75 on-rim per tire* for passenger and light truck tires. All other tires \$26.00 and up. For special tires, please call ahead of time for cost estimates. *Westmoreland Cleanways members receive a discount of \$.50/tire.

Freon Removal (refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers): \$20 per unit.

Salandro's Refuse, Liberty Tire of Ohio, and the Appliance Warehouse will be taking the material for recycling. We also thank the Westmoreland Fair board and Colony Holding of North Huntingdon for the generous use of their property.


