Recycling in 2010

I don't think too many people are sorry to see 2009 behind us. The recycling industry is emerging in 2010 with a different face than it had before, but perhaps with a more realistic one. Industry insiders have long known that "recycling is not free". While there was money to be made when times were good, somebody had to pay the bills when times were not so good. To the average person, recycling appeared to be "free"; in reality, the industry was subsidized through a combination of government subsidies, grants, and incentives that hid the true cost of collecting and processing the material. The other issue was that, while recycling is the environmentally preferred way to manage waste in order to conserve our natural resources and protect our environment (which it does), recyclables are also a commodity that only has value if someone else wants it. And someone else only wants it if it can be remade into something that can be sold at a profit, after the cost of collecting, processing, and manufacturing are covered.



Where does that leave us now? As of this writing, some recycling markets are stronger, but overall, the manufacturing sector has not yet recovered to where there is a great demand for many common recyclables. Having an equally dramatic impact on the future of recycling programs is the scheduled elimination of

Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PA DEP) grant programs that subsidized many municipal recycling programs. Those grant programs were paid from a recycling fund that is scheduled to "sunset" as of January 1, 2012.

Getting back to the notion that recycling has been free, we actually paid for the programs every

time we paid our garbage bills. Since 1990, waste haulers have paid a \$2.00 per ton tipping fee every time they took a load of municipal waste to the landfill. That \$2.00 per ton was placed into the recycling fund administered by the PA DEP, which was then portioned to counties and municipalities through various recycling grant programs. The state's recycling grants were a great incentive to get recycling programs started back in 1990, especially in mandated municipalities that had to develop programs, hire staff, and purchase equipment.

The recycling grants also provided an incentive for municipalities to continue to encourage recycling by rewarding them based on the volume of recyclables collected. Some municipalities invested the money back into their recycling programs, and other used the grant funds to pay for extras or special programs.

Westmoreland Cleanways was not eligible directly for the DEP grants, but worked with municipalities to increase their grant awards. Grant funds coming back to Westmoreland County communities averaged \$120,000 and more over the last few years. Some municipalities received less than \$100; others received thousands. Every bit helped our municipalities fund services they normally would not have been able to.

The important point to remember, though, was that we paid for the recycling fund every time we sent a check to our waste hauler. If your municipality did not claim DEP grant funds, it was paid to another municipality in another county.

As of this writing, the PA DEP has announced its plan for shutting down the recycling grant program at the end of 2012, accounting for funds that have already been committed, and the funds that will be collected through 2011. A vote is scheduled for the beginning of January to extend the recycling fee through 2020. Recycling industry leaders have been lobbying our state legislators for months on the importance of recycling to fund our communities, and to promote proper disposal and responsible use of our natural resources.

IF the recycling fund is **not extended**, municipal and county recycling programs across the state will be faced with elimination.

IF it is **extended**, there will be a collective sigh of relief.

ALL OF US, however, residents, businesses, municipal officials and recycling professionals, must face the reality that recycling needs to be economically sustainable if it is to survive in the long term. Recycling will rebound, but with a substantially different face than we've grown used to seeing.

We at Westmoreland Cleanways will stay on top of the discussions in the recycling industry and continue to look for ways to keep recycling opportunities alive and growing for everyone.

So What Do We Do?

There are still lots of opportunities to recycle; in fact, more than there were just a couple years ago. Many municipalities now have curbside single stream recycling in addition to community drop-off programs. We may begin to experience an increase in our waste bill because our haulers now have to pay a fee to take recyclables to the recycling plant. It may not be attributed to recycling on your bill, but it's a safe bet that the two are connected.

Voluntary drop-off programs will vary, depending on what is being collected and how strong the market is for the material. Processors don't enter into collection programs lightly; there's too much investment and too much to lose. They are willing to ride out some rough spots if there is hope that markets will turn around. Take advantage of existing drop-off programs such as Abitibi's paper program and cardboard, plastic/glass/cans programs that are located at several municipalities. Check out www.westmorelandcleanways.org for a continuously updated list of recycling options.

Of course, reduce your waste in the first place and you won't have to worry about recycling it. Check out the following pages for more ideas about how you can improve your home environment and help keep Westmoreland County beautiful.

Recycle Stuff at GreenForge

Moving to the GreenForge Building on Donohoe Road was a great move. The GreenForge Building is a great example of sustainability. It employs geothermal heating and cooling, solar panels, permeable surface paving, and a green roof (creates some interesting sounds during a rainstorm)! Neighbors like the Smart Growth Partnership, Western PA Coalition for Abandoned Mine Reclamation, and PA Home Energy provide a built-in resource of like-minded colleagues. We're more accessible than we ever were, making it convenient for visitors to drop by with their recyclables. And they do!

At any given time, we have a shipment of household and rechargeable batteries, inkjet and laser printer cartridges, videotapes, DVD/CDs, small electronics, and cell phones. We also recycle telephone books and small propane tanks. We have recycling resources and literature available, we can schedule programs, and show you what your rain barrel or compost bin will look like.

Compost Bin/Rain Barrel Sale—Fundraiser

There's still time to reserve your compost bin or rain barrel before the offer is made public prior to the March 27 distribution event. Holiday sales were brisk, indicating that we should have a good sale. You can download an order form at www.westmorelandcleanways.org, or we can mail or email one to you.

Remember, the days of FREE compost bins are over (another PA DEP grant program that we can be thankful for while it lasted, but will not be coming back). Just check at any garden supply store or website to see what a great value these composters and rain barrels are. A portion of the proceeds from each composter or rain barrel sold will be used to fund the many recycling and cleanup programs Westmoreland Cleanways offers.

Cleanup Season Approaches

Fugitive Tire Roundup

Plans for the 2010 Fugitive Tire Roundup are under way. This annual program, sponsored by area tire dealers, recruits youth groups (posses) from throughout the county to capture tires that have escaped into the wild (fields, streams, roadsides) and turn them in to participating tire dealers for proper disposal. By corralling the illegally dumped tires, each posse will earn a bounty that it can use to further its own community projects.

Since 1995, over 50,000 fugitive tires that blighted our Westmoreland County landscape have been captured. Scout groups, school groups, 4-H and church groups earned over \$37,500 in bounty payments that flowed back into our community through other service projects. The Roundup is a valuable tool to help rid our landscape of illegally disposed tires, to educate participants on the environmental damage caused by the dumping, and to foster community pride.



This year, special focus will be on the tire piles identified in PA CleanWays' 2009 Illegal Dump Survey. Literally thousands of tires were found in a majority of the 300 Westmoreland County sites. We'd like to concentrate on cleaning up those sites, and request that posses target those tires for this year's roundup. A complete list of sites is available in our office, with an approximate number of tires at each site.

To join the Fugitive Tire Roundup, posses must follow a few rules:

- ◇ Pre-register by March 19, 2010
- ◇ Choose one Saturday in April (3, 10, 17 and 24) on which to conduct the cleanup.
- ◇ Turn tires in to a participating tire dealer assigned by Westmoreland Cleanways.
- ◇ Tires cannot be stockpiled prior to the collection date; no tires can be collected from businesses or private individuals.
- ◇ Tires must be collected and turned in on the same day.
- ◇ Only tires off-rim can be accepted, and tires must be turned in to the tire dealer by Noon of the scheduled collection date.

To collect the bounty:

- ◇ A bounty is paid for the first 200 tires turned in (\$.75 per tire; maximum of \$150). Many posses capture many more than that.
- ◇ Posses are encouraged to take before- and after- photos of the cleanup sites and to discuss reasons the tires may have been illegally dumped.
- ◇ Participants must complete a survey after the roundup and return it to Westmoreland Cleanways in order to claim the bounty.

The 2009 Illegal Dump Survey lists over 300 sites in Westmoreland County that could use some TLC. Most of them aren't big at all. A couple people with a pickup truck would take care of them. PennDOT will even pick up trash left along a state road if your cleanup is registered through the program. Education News

Backyard Composting Workshops

Westmoreland Cleanways continues a full season of Backyard Composting Workshops for 2010 (see Calendar of Events on Page 7). We're happy to be working with some new partners and some old friends to make the workshops more accessible and to showcase our partners' facilities. Our first workshop of the year will be March 24 at the Winnie Palmer Nature Reserve on the campus of St. Vincent College in Latrobe. Three workshops will be held at The Barn at Donohoe Center, home of the Westmoreland Conservation District. Two workshops will be held at Oak Hollow Park in North Huntingdon Township; finally, two workshops are scheduled for Waste Management's Valley Landfill in Penn Township (see following story).

Pre-registration is required for all classes; there is a \$10 per person material fee payable at the door. FREE COMPOST BINS are no longer available, but can be purchased on March 27 (see Page 3 for details). A limited number of bins MAY be available for sale at a later date, but we cannot guarantee that additional compost bins will be available after the sale. Spotlight On Valley Landfill

Waste Management-Valley Landfill has been a good friend to Westmoreland Cleanways for many years, and donates free landfill space each year for all the trash collected during our cleanup activities. We are especially pleased to partner with WM-Valley Landfill on our backyard composting workshops to highlight their conservation and community outreach programs.

Valley Landfill has the only permitted commercial compost site in Westmoreland County, and won a 2009 Waste Watcher Award for its composting activities. Westmoreland Cleanways, along with representatives of the Botanical Society of Westmoreland County and Penn State Master Gardeners, worked with Waste Management and Valley Landfill staff on the Wildlife Habitat Council's Corporate Lands for Learning program, which culminated in Valley achieving the designation of Certified Wildlife Habitat. Future plans call for the development of various gardens and outdoor learning spaces to complete the CLL certification.

Participants at the backyard composting workshops will see a commercial compost facility in action, as well as state-of-the-art landfill technology. We look forward to some great workshops at Valley.

Earth Day is Just Around The Corner

While we're suffering through the cold of January, we and our colleagues are busy planning for this year's Earth Day activities. Westmoreland Earth Day will be held at the Winnie Palmer Nature Reserve on Saturday, April 24. 2010 Hard-to-Recycle Stuff Collections

Collection season will be starting up in April, with two collections scheduled for the Westmoreland Fairgrounds and two at the Norwin Hills Shopping Center (see the Calendar of Events for dates). Tires, lead acid batteries, scrap metal, Freon appliances, and e-waste will be collected. Fees will apply to tires, Freon appliances and e-waste, based on vendor pricing. Tires will be \$1.75 per tire off-rim and \$2.75 per tire on-rim; Freon appliances are \$20 per unit. Visit www.westmorelandcleanways.org or call 724-836-4129 for a complete pricelist for e-waste.
